As people so graciously and kindly reminded me a week or so ago, I am now 50 years old. Or perhaps 50 years young! But despite the sentiment, we are all getting older, and as folks often remind me aching in more and more places.

Growing up I knew lots of 'old' people, mainly through church and in my family. They all showed a great interest in me, gave of their time and talents, and were role models to me in a host of different ways.

One of my relatives, I'll call her Auntie B, always seemed pleased to see us all, but could be very blunt and critical in her comments. There were clearly people and places that in her mind didn't quite measure up and she was not afraid to say so. I got the impression the home she spent her last days in wasn't really good enough for her.


Compare her with my grandmother, a little old lady with a very strong character. She suffered from arthritis to the extent that her hands were misshapen. Every so often we would be told that she had been rushed to the hospital in the night with some form of internal complication. She struggled to walk any distance so never came on our walks to explore the woods. And yet I never heard her complain, not once. She usually said grace before dinner and I will always remember with huge fondness and eternal gratitude how she told me, a fit and healthy twenty something at the time, how she prayed for me every night.

We are all role models, in some way shape or form, to those around us. Whether we like it or not people see us, copy us, imitate us and remember us. In Corinthians Paul tells us we are *"the fragrance of Christ to those around us"*. I long to be the sort of Christlike influence to others that my grandmother was to me. I hope that is true for all of us.
