NATIVITY – THE MISSING INGREDIENT

Although Nativity plays and tableaux are becoming less common, there will certainly still be many such plays performed in schools and churches and Nativity scenes may well be set up in some homes and shops.

There will be, of course, Mary, Joseph and the babe in the manger together with shepherds, wise men and angels the odd ox and ass and perhaps a scattering of straw.

In the past stable scenes have even included such things as spacemen, badgers and dinosaurs! For obvious reasons the thing that is always left out of the manger scene whether in schools, churches, homes etc is, putting it politely, - the mess, the muck, the stink. It is hardly surprising that people working with livestock spend their days in 'wellies'.

Much is made of the symbolism that the Son of God was born in a stable. No room for him, not wanted, coming in the humblest of circumstances. I would like to add that coming to a mucky, stinking stable symbolised the fact that he was coming in to a mucky, messed up, stinking world. With the purpose, thank God, of starting the clean-up operation!

All this puts me in mind of a favourite Christmas song of mine. It is sung from the perspective of someone looking in to the manger questioning what this baby has taken on.

The words of the chorus go:

'What's a nice person like you, Doing on a planet like this, Can't you see you could get hurt down here, Even betrayed by a kiss.'

The song is written and sung by pastor Bob McLeod an evangelist who uses his songs in sharing the Good News.

Dear Fellowship ...

'What are you prepared to do?'- a quote from one of my favourite childhood films. The film in question is The Untouchables, the story of Eliot Ness and his gang of law enforcers as they set out to bring an end to the antics of Al Capone. The quote I refer to could just as easily have been 'What are you prepared to give up?' as it was being aimed at Mr Ness and asking him what he was really prepared to sacrifice to bring those he was hunting to justice.

If someone asked the same question of God, today or 2000 years ago, he would have a reply. His reply was and still is "I am prepared to say goodbye to my only Son whom I love so much, to watch him leave this incredible place where we are together, and go to a dark and evil place where he will be tortured and killed. I am prepared to do that to win back those I love, those who I made, even though they may have no time for me at all" And that's the essence of the Christmas message! A baby in a manger begins the greatest rescue of all time.

So, to each of us today, especially at Christmas, 'What are you prepared to do, or to sacrifice?' Who can you invite to a Christmas service, or give a Christmas gospel tract to, or talk to? Who can you invite to your house in order to show them gospel hospitality? Who is there on the edges of society who needs someone to take an interest in them this Christmas? I find it easy at Christmas to give money away to a charitable cause, because that's in my Christmas budget and I can still have nice food and plenty of material blessings. But what about sacrifice, what about me going without something, so that others may benefit. Jesus commended not the wealthy man who put lots of money into the offering box at Church, but the widow who gave everything and paid the price herself.

The King of Glory and Ruler of Eternity was prepared to give up that which came at huge cost to Himself – for you and me. So, this Christmas, 'What are YOU prepared to do?'
