

It's hard because on the outside it all looks shiny and perfect. Sunday best in behaviour and dress.

However, underneath those layers, you find a body of imperfect people, carnal souls, selfish motives.

But, here is the beauty of church—

Church isn't a building, mentality, or expectation.

Church is a body.

Church is a group of sinners, saved by grace, living in fellowship as saints.

Church is a body of believers bound as brothers and sisters by an eternal love.

Church is a holy ground where sinners stand as equals before the Throne of Grace.

Church is a refuge for broken hearts and a training ground for mighty warriors.

Church is a converging of confrontation and invitation. Where sin is confronted and hearts are invited to seek restoration.

Church is a lesson in faith and trust.

Church is a bearer of burdens and a giver of hope.

Church is a family. A family coming together, setting aside differences, forgetting past mistakes, rejoicing in the smallest of victories.

Dear Fellowship...

At our church meeting this month we are to decide whether or not to pursue adopting a pastor into our leadership team. At our last meeting we asked that we spent time in personal prayer over this very important step in the future of our church.

Foremost in all of our minds, regardless of our personal views, must be that God's will must be done. The trouble is that we don't know what God's will is!

All we can do to be sure we remain in God's will, is to stick to Biblical principles and to pray.

According to the New Testament, Church leadership falls on the shoulders of elders and deacons. The word elder is translated 'presbyter' or 'pastor' or 'shepherd'. In Acts 20 17-35, Paul is clearly addressing a group of men, who are overseers of the Ephesian church.

It is also clear from the NT that every church has elders (plural). The pattern is a group of men (and they are always men in the NT) are responsible for the spiritual leadership of the church. There is no mention of a church with a single elder/pastor who is in charge of everything! This is not a Biblical pattern in the NT. Acts 6 shows the responsibility of the congregation to appoint deacons. Without them being called deacons, we have such people within our church.

Whilst we at MBC make all our decisions through the Church Meeting, the idea that congregations hire professional ministers to do the work of the church is unbiblical.

Please, please, please ask our Sovereign God to make clear to us the way forward.
