News From Ukraine

The church that Sue and I support in Ukraine, is based in a small market town of some 15,000 people and in particular with its outreach to a village of some 500 people about 6 miles away. Talne - the town and Korsunka - the village are situated in the Cherkassy Oblast (State) of Central Ukraine roughly half way between Kyiv and Odesa.

Because of its position and small population, it has not been a target in the war, the nearest rocket strike being about an hour's drive away. Apart from the occasional air-raid warning and the sight of some drones there has been little direct effect.

At first children had to attend school in shifts as the air-raid shelters were not big enough to cope but now they are all back at school full-time. There is no shortage of any of life's essentials including petrol and they had no power cuts this winter. There are also fewer refugees on the move. People are very thankful for their safety.

On a negative note, we have heard that some of the young boys from Korsunka have been killed in action.

Despite the relatively safe situation the general feeling is one of weariness and tiredness with the whole situation, and there is certainly fear mixed with deep anger. The anti-Russian emotion can be summed up by a situation when a schoolboy asked to read aloud a passage which included the word Moscow, refused to read it.

Thank you to everyone who completed the questionnaire about Bible Study and prayer meeting/Sunday evening services. Following the analysis of responses, the following changes will be made to encourage wider attendance and participation:

Dear Fellowship...

If like me you sometimes give in to the seductive powers of social media you will know that people post all manner of things particularly about their family and often about what they believe. Not uncommon is the post referring to a dead friend or relative who is now 'One of the stars', or 'Singing with Angels', or something similar. It rather reveals that which is deep within us all – a desire for knowledge and reassurance about what happens when we die. Death is at the centre of the Easter story. The death of Jesus Christ and his resurrection, and the conquest of death itself as the writer to the Corinthians says – "Where O death is your victory? Where O death is your sting?"

The Bible clearly teaches us that death is the result of rebellion against God, and after death we will all go to one of two places. The Bible calls these Heaven and Hell and it has definitions that are increasingly different to those given in our society today. Heaven, where God is, and Hell where God is not. Heaven for those who accept the free offer of a place there, and Hell for those who do not want to spend eternity with God. Not really anything to do with how 'good' we are or what we think we have earned.

The Scottish preacher Alistair Begg, in one of his many sermons, tells of one of the men – a thief – who was crucified next to Jesus at Easter. A man who at the gates of Heaven had to confess he was not baptised, had not been a churchgoer, had no understanding of the Bible or theology and had possibly never prayed, as well as being a pretty awful person. Yet a man who was granted entry to eternity with his Saviour on the strength of the promise he clung to "The man on the middle cross said I could come in."

I am baptised and have attended church for many years. I read my Bible and have some understanding of it, and I pray. I have been complemented over the years and told I am a good sort, or a decent bloke or whatever. But as I know to my shame, and as God knows even better, I have done nothing at all to deserve a place in the perfection of Heaven. Like the thief on the cross, my ONLY chance and my ONLY hope is that I hold tight to the actions and promises of Jesus Christ and will also have to say at the gates of paradise "The man on the middle cross said I could come in".

That which is on offer through what Jesus accomplished at the first Easter, is of far greater worth than ANYTHING else. You will never get a better offer in all the world. This Easter if you have not already taken it, there is NOTHING better you could possibly do!
