Dear Fellowship...

As I write this, storm Babet is passing over. It's a miserable day. Lynda and I have certainly considered getting under blankets in front of the TV and binging rubbish! Sometimes we can get into that kind of mood in our Christian service; we prefer to stay comfy and warm rather than be active and get cold and wet!

At Bible Study, on the last two Thursdays, we have been encouraged by God's attitude to us when we feel like that. We read in Isaiah 42 v 3, *"A bruised reed he will not break and a smouldering wick he will not snuff out"*.

Despite our enthusiasm for God's work he recognises that we get weary, tired and disillusioned. But he promises not to discard us. In fact, he promises the opposite. In Isaiah 43 v 20 He says He *"will provide water in the desert and streams in the wasteland"*. After storm Babet, water is probably the last thing we need, but Isaiah is speaking spiritually. When our lives are spiritually dry, God provides the refreshment we need for our souls. It is there for the taking. 'You can take a horse to water but you can't make it drink'. As Christians, we need to drink!

Verse 10 of Isaiah 43 says, "*You are my witnesses*". No matter what spiritual or physical state we find ourselves in, we will always be God's witnesses. At Measham we are an amazingly evangelical church. That is down to the efforts of the members of its fellowship. Be encouraged to keep up the work. Apart from our weekly activities, we have a men's breakfast, an afternoon tea and the Measham lights event coming up.

The big event in November is a double Baptism on the morning of November 26th. Please make every effort to invite people to this. It is by the "*foolishness of preaching*" that people will be saved. People will always make excuses (see Luke 14 vs 18-20) but our role is to keep on inviting. We trust God in His wisdom to do the rest!
